# **Trek**

Departure : Museum of Modern Art of Collioure Arrival : Museum of Modern Art of Collioure

- 1. Head towards the Museum of Modern Art, then follow the signs to Fort Saint-Elme. Don't miss the stop at La Glorieta for its beautiful view of Collioure.
- 2. After the mill, take the steep path on the right. Turn left onto the small road called Chemin du Col de la Mala Cara.
- 3. At the white cross, turn left again towards Collioure. Keep to the left along the Route Impériale.
- 4. Cross the D114 and follow the signs for the coastal trail on the left.

#### **Environmental sensitive areas**



## Collioure Mill (A)

This windmill is quite rare in the area, most of which are water mills. It ceases its activity in the nineteenth century and gradually turns into ruins. Perfectly restored in a traditional way by the municipality in 2001, it is now in working order for the elaboration of Collioure olive oil. Near the city, it is a perfect destination for a nice little walk.
